Elective Courses (9 hours, Thesis):

A student selecting the thesis option must complete the core course and seminar course requirements. Six of the remaining 9 credit hours may be granted for thesis research. The six thesis research hours are normally taken in three-hour increments over the two successive semesters, immediately preceding graduation, and after course requirements are completed.
