

Master of Arts Criminology and Criminal Justice

Degree Program

A minimum of 30 credit hours is required, at least 21 of which are in Criminology and Criminal Justice. 12 of these hours represent the core of the curriculum.

- **Non-thesis option**: requires a minimum of 30 credit hours, which includes the 12-hour core course requirement, at least 9 hours of seminar courses within the Department, and 9 hours of electives.
- **Thesis option**: Students must complete the 12 hours of core courses, at least 9 hours of seminar courses, and a combination of electives AND thesis research hours (typically taken in 3 hour increments over two semesters).

Application Requirements

- 1. Application
 - a. https://www.umsl.edu/admissions/applications.html
- 2. Statement of Purpose
 - a. In 1-2 pages, briefly explain why an advanced degree in criminology and criminal justice is of interest and why the applicant merits serious consideration.
- 3. Official transcripts from all universities attended
 - a. Successful applicants must have completed a baccalaureate degree before beginning the master's program.
- 4. Entrance examinations
 - a. The Graduate Record Examination General Test is not required but may add value to the application.
 - International students are required to document English proficiency by providing scores from an internationally accepted standardized examination before a decision is made on admission. See International Admissions for more information: https://www.umsl.edu/global/admissions/grad.html
- 5. Grade Point Average
 - a. Minimum of 3.0 on 4.0 scale in the last 60 hours of the undergraduate degree.
- 6. Two Letters of recommendation
 - a. Letters of recommendation from persons qualified to evaluate the applicant's recent academic performance are required.

Priority deadline April 1st.

Applications submitted after April 1st will be considered for admission on a rolling basis.
